1. Call to Order:

2. Ratification of Previous Minutes:

It was resolved that the Draft Minutes for September 6th 2023 be approved, confirmed and ratified with such grammatical and other changes as discussed in the meeting.

3. Lands and Survey Updates:

The Board gave a written directive to the Lands and Survey Departments' Valuation and Estate Officer, to issue a final settlement offer to the Claimant of Block Parcel on the 23rd March 2023. The written directive was rescinded and a new directive was issued for a full and final offer to the Claimant of Block Parcel The Board gave the MD the new directive to submit the updated offer to the Lands and Survey Department, who will then serve the Claimant.

4. Progress on the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA):

MD Howard gave an updated overview of the EIA and noted that the EIA team had a steering committee meeting on Tuesday 19th September 2023.

MD Howard noted the Terms of Reference covered the following:

- Addresses the applicable environmental laws and regulations;
- Establishes the assessment methodologies;
- Guides the overall activities required for the environmental studies; and
- Evaluates the following applicable resources:
 - o Socio-Economic Considerations;
 - o Hydrology and Drainage (including climate resiliency);
 - o Geo-Environmental;
 - o Terrestrial Ecology;
 - o Cultural and Natural Heritage Trust-Protected Areas;
 - o Greenhouse Gas Emissions; and
 - Noise and Vibration.

Other areas worth noting that were presented were:

- National Priorities;
- East West Arterial Project Objectives;
- Alternatives Evaluation;
- Hydrology, Drainage and Geo-Environmental;
- · Rainfall Data;
- Static Velocity Flow;
- 100-year rainstorm event -flood levels in feet;
- Watershed with surface flow patterns;
- Recommended Bridge or Culvert Openings;
- Multi-modal Corridor Design (220ft); and
- Highway Solar Arrays.
- Flood Mitigation and fauna access;
- Potential Impacts and Mitigation Measures;
- Wetlands Construction BMPs; and

• The Case for the East-West Arterial.

The full EIA commenced mid-June 2023. The timeline for completion of the EIA is set for approximately May / June 2024.

The next steps are: work on the preliminaries such as traffic data collection, Section 3 Gazette, preliminary road design, procurement of drainage structures, road base materials (stockpile), and financing.
