<p><b>Always yield to the vehicle on your right</b> <b>Do Not Use Outer Lane for No More than Two Exits!</b></p> <div style="display: flex;"> <div style="width: 50%; padding-right: 5px;"> <p><b>DRIVING LEFT</b></p> <p>When turning left:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Approach from the outer lane</li> <li>• Move to the inner lane</li> <li>• Give way and enter when there is a safe gap</li> <li>• Release left hand</li> <li>• Move to the Outer Lane</li> </ul> </div> <div style="width: 50%; padding-left: 5px;"> <p><b>DRIVING RIGHT ON MAINWAY &amp; 27 DRIVE</b></p> <p>When turning right or making a U-turn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Approach from the inner lane</li> <li>• Release left hand</li> <li>• Give way and enter when there is a safe gap</li> <li>• Keep to the inner lane</li> <li>• Release left hand</li> </ul> </div> </div>	<p><b>Large Vehicles</b></p> <p>Drivers should be aware that large trucks may not be able to turn right. Therefore, when you are driving in an exit lane, check the rearview mirror through a rear window to see if a truck has a right hand roundabout as a way through to you.</p> <p><b>Large Trucks</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• When making a U-turn or turning right, use the inner lane</li> <li>• When making a U-turn or turning left, use the outer lane</li> </ul>	<p><b>Pedestrian Rights</b></p> <p>Before crossing the roundabout, pedestrians should check for the direction of approach traffic. That is, if you are walking on the roundabout, use a path that avoids crossing a safe area between vehicles' paths. Be aware of vehicle crossing and waiting at the roundabout.</p>	<p><b>Cyclist</b></p> <p>Always keep an eye on the traffic and consider that you need to roundabout - that may not be a road user as you. Pedestrians can be vulnerable to collisions with you. Always look for other vehicles, cyclists, and people waiting at the roundabout.</p>
<p><b>DRIVING STRAIGHT AHEAD</b></p> <p>When going straight ahead:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Give way and enter when there is a safe gap</li> <li>• Release left hand</li> <li>• Release both hands and stay in that lane</li> </ul>	<p><b>Choose Your Lane:</b></p> <p>Lane choice at a roundabout is similar to a standard intersection. When approaching, choose either the outer or inner lane that corresponds to your intended movement. Lane choice is based on the driver's intention. The outer lane allows right, straight ahead, and left movements. The inner lane allows right and left movements. In some cases, the outer lane may also allow straight ahead movements.</p>	<p><b>Emergency Vehicles:</b></p> <p>Always give emergency vehicles the right of way when they approach. If you have any way through the roundabout, pull over to the right allowing emergency vehicles to pass. Never enter the roundabout. Continue to your exit and then pull over to the right, allowing the emergency vehicles to maneuver around you.</p>	<p>Always keep an eye on the traffic and consider that you need to roundabout - that may not be a road user as you.
